Assisted Reproductive Technology (ART) Law is a relatively new and everchanging area of law. As frequently happens in society, the science is ahead of the law. Services Available

Donor Agreements

It is extremely important for both the donors and the intended parents that all legal issues related to the donation of eggs and/or sperm and/or embryos are addressed prior to any medical procedure. We can assist in negotiating and drafting a legal document to ensure that all expectations and intents are clarified and protected.

Gestational Carrier Agreements (GCAs)

These agreements are extremely important to ensure the rights and responsibilities of both the carrier and the intended parents. Most assisted reproduction facilities will not transfer an embryo or other donated biological material to the uterus of a gestational carrier without a signed contract. All ART Law contracts are complex documents that should be drafted by a skilled attorney with experience in ART Law.

Declarations of Parentage

There is a presumption under North Carolina law that a woman who gives birth to a child is the child's mother, and her spouse (if married) is the child's other father. As such, legal action is necessary in order to direct the hospital and state agencies as to the true identities of the parent(s), and to declare legal parentage which is portable to other states.

A Declaration of Parentage is a court order that is often entered prior to birth (i.e., PreBirth Order) that accomplishes, among other things, the very important task of declaring the identities of the child's legal parents, and directing relevant state agencies as to whose name(s) should be placed on the child's birth certificate. Under certain circumstances, these can also be entered after the birth of the child (i.e., PostBirth Orders), resulting in the same outcome.
